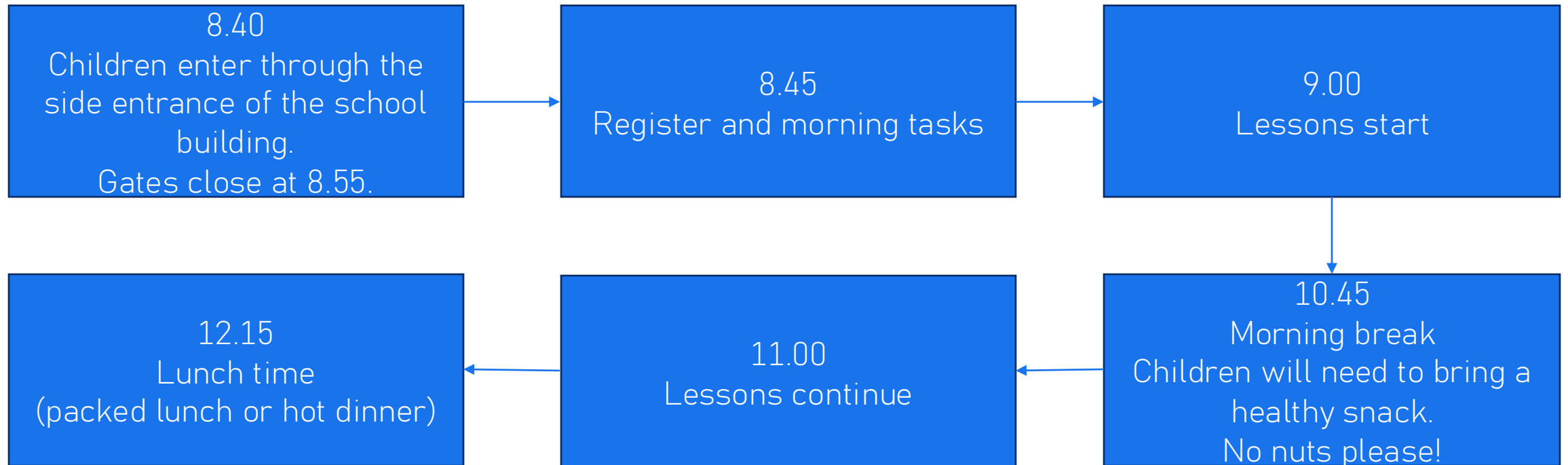

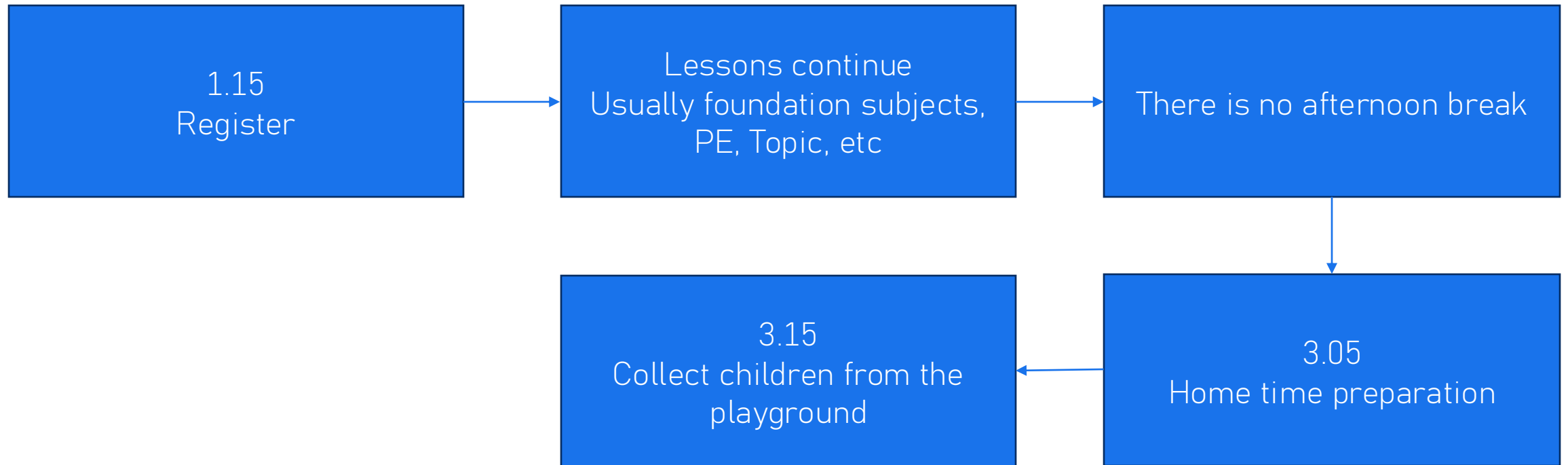

Times Table Rock Stars and Numbots

- Your child will have a TTRS and Numbots login and password (the same for both).
- Please encourage your child to practice their times tables and addition/subtraction using these websites.
- We suggest about 10 minutes each week as a minimum.



Reading
