What do they learn in the Spring term?

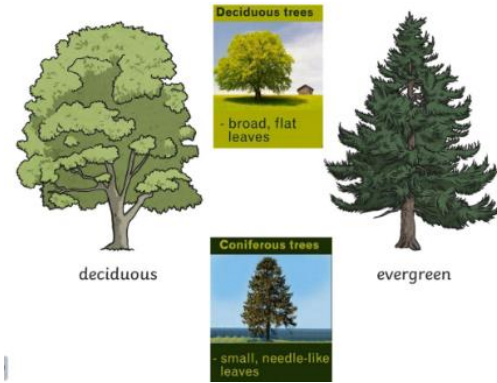
Our topics are: Toys and What a wonderful world!

In Year 1 our aim is to transition the children from the EYFS curriculum onto the National Curriculum, we aim to start the academic year with small groups, and carpet times with opportunities for play and independent learning, much like Reception. As the year progresses, the classrooms will take on a more formal appearance, the amount of free play is reduced, and we move the children to whole class teaching ready for Year 2.



Growth Mindset

The Year 1 curriculum not only aims to teach the children the core subjects but also encourages them to develop their growth mindset. This means we give them challenges that help to develop skills in the following areas:

Problem Solving

Independence

Resilience

Collaboration

To support their development of these important life skills we ask you to encourage them to use them at home too.

A typical morning in Year 1

All children enter through the Year 1 door at the side of the school. All grown-ups need to leave their child at the door and follow the one-way system around the building.

Any messages to be passed to Mrs Smith or Mrs Hine and they will hand these over to the appropriate class teacher.

8.40 Register, morning activities, reading sessions and small group work.

9.00 Start core learning in consistent groupings.

10.15 Morning play

10.30 Learning continued

11.45 Lunch

12.45 - Afternoon lessons begin.



2.00 - Playtime.



2.45 - Tidy up and Storytime



3.15 - Hometime. Children will line up in their allocated place on the playground.

Homework And Reading



► Homework

- Homework will be given to your child on a Friday on a fortnightly basis. Please return the Homework book on the Wednesday of the second week to enable us to mark it in good time.
- Homework will include work based around our curriculum theme and number fluency.

► Reading

- Your child will read a Collins Big Cats reading book in school with a teacher or teaching assistant. In each session we will be focusing on decoding the words using phonics, expression and comprehension. Your child will be issued a paper copy of their reading book to bring home each week. Your child will also have a 'sharing book' which they will not be able to read, this book should be shared and enjoyed with an adult.
- Books will be sent home on Monday and must be returned by Thursday please.

School Uniform

PE kit

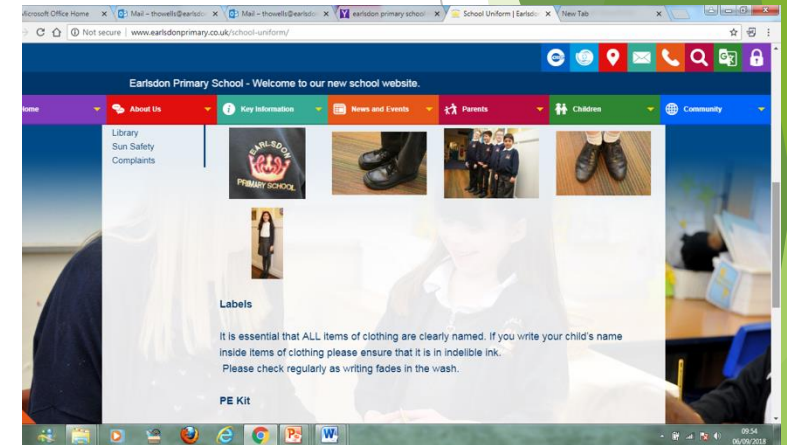
Outside PE is on a Tuesday
