- ❖ **Be a role model to the younger children in our school who haven't learnt as much as you yet!**



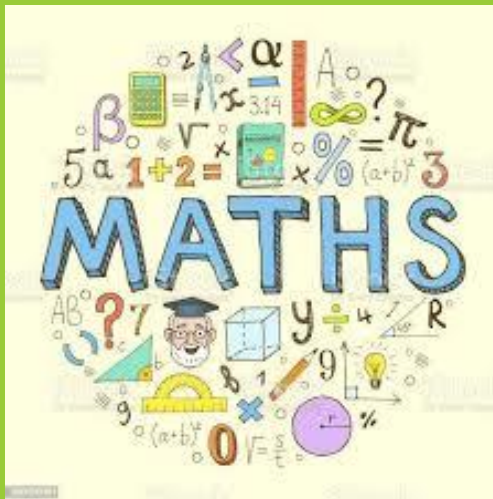
CURRICULUM

- We are going to learn so much in Year 2!
- Every day there will be English, phonics and maths with your teachers
- Some of you will work in small groups with Mrs Leigh.
- In the afternoon we will learn lots about different subjects including Geography, Music, Circle times, Science and History and Computing.

Our main maths lessons are based around the “Maths No Problem” scheme which children have used in Year 1 and are familiar with.

We also use other resources to practise maths facts and consolidate learning.

YEAR 2 MATHS FACTS



By the end of Year 2, most children will be able to recall these key maths facts:

Number bonds to 20 (addition and subtraction facts)

Number bonds to 100 (multiples 10, e.g. 20 + 80)

Doubles to 20

Halves to 20

2x, 5x, 10x tables (and work out related division facts)

Be able to count in 2s, 5s, 10s up to 100

Our main writing lessons follow the “Ready Steady Write” approach. This enables children to build sustained pieces of writing over a number of weeks, whilst embedding grammar skills.

Children also have additional sessions to introduce new grammar concepts, handwriting and spelling.

YEAR 2 WRITING SKILLS



By the end of Year 2, most children will be able to

Write organized pieces of work in a variety of genres.
The amount they write will increase this year.

Write accurate sentences that use capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

Use handwriting that is consistent in size, orientation and on the line.

Use the present or past tense consistently.

Join ideas together using a range of conjunctions – and, but, because, if, when.

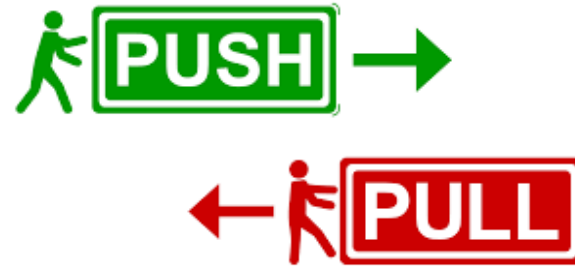
Spell a range of “common exception words” correctly. The list of these words is [here](#).

WHAT DO WE LEARN IN THE AUTUMN TERM?

This term we are learning about all things that fly!

As historians, we will find out about how flight has changed over time and learn about important individuals who contributed to the development of aeroplanes – including someone who used to go to our school!

We will also learn about how our local area has changed since this person was alive.

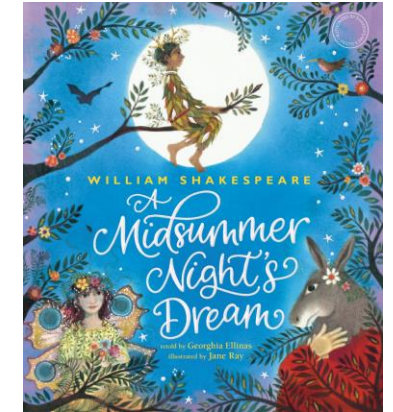


WHAT DO WE LEARN IN THE SPRING TERM?

As scientists, we are learning about animal habitats and what animals need to survive.

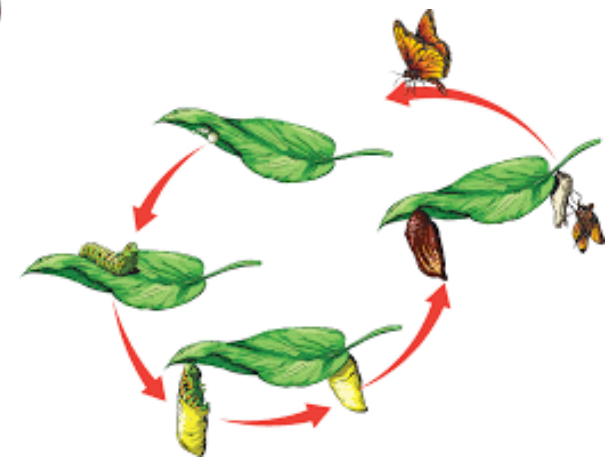
We also read, write and act out the Shakespearian tale 'A Midsummer Night's Dream.'



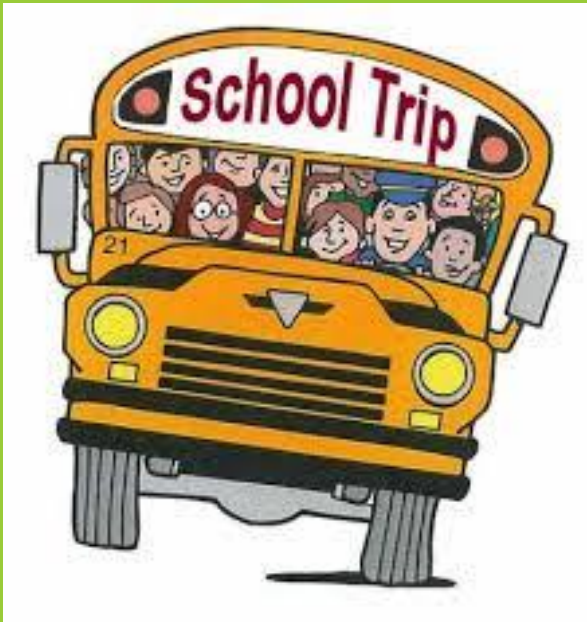
WHAT DO WE LEARN IN THE SUMMER TERM?

A TYPICAL MORNING IN YEAR 2



8:40 - All children enter through the double blue doors at the side of the school next to the sensory garden.

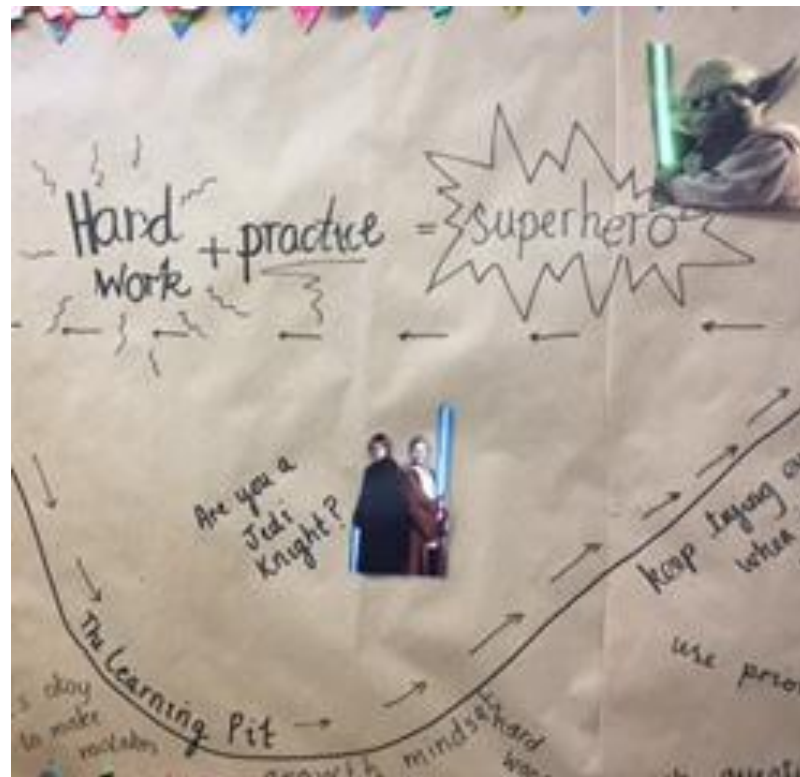

HOME LEARNING

Weekly Reading

Your child will read a Little Wandle Collins reading book in school with a teacher or learning assistant. In each session we will be focusing on decoding the words using phonics, expression and comprehension.

Your child will also be able to read the same book at home. In addition, your child will also have a 'sharing book' which they may not be able to read by themselves, this book should be shared and enjoyed with an adult. **New books will be given out on a Monday and collected on Friday.**

Fortnightly Home Learning tasks and projects

Home learning tasks will be given to your child on a **Friday** on a fortnightly basis.

This will be on a sheet that is put inside your child's home learning book. (please stick in any work that your child does)

Homework may include work based around reading, comprehension, number fluency, grammar and spelling.

There will be occasional projects for children who like to have extra creative challenges, linked to our theme.

Please return the Homework book on the Wednesday of the second week to enable us to mark it in good time.

INDOOR PE – Tuesday afternoon

Children should come to school in their PE kits for their outdoor PE lesson on Wednesdays.

OTHER THINGS

- Children should not bring in their own pencil cases as we will provide them with all the resources they need.
